Visual Arts: Arts & Crafts (Mixed Media) Classes

Grades K – Adult (6 years and under must be accompanied by an adult)

Mondays ◆ 4:30 - 6:30 PM ◆ \$30-35 per class (includes supplies)

Feb. 3 & 10 Papier Máché: "Valentine" Hearts Sculpture

The class will create a double heart sculpture from paper and paste which will harden by class two where it will be painted and decorated for a gift or a center piece. Two classes: \$35

Feb. 17 **Beginning Painting**

Students will use acrylic paints to create a finished painting and learn to chose a color scheme, mix colors, and shade objects. \$30

Feb. 24 & March 3 Clay Sculpture

Students will create a finished clay piece of their choice of an object or animal using professional tools and ideas. The pieces will be kiln-fired to a hard bisque and be painted in class 2. Two classes \$35

March 10 **Mosaic Tile Art** - This class will offer students several wooden designs to choose from and a choice of colored glass and ceramic tiles, shells, and jewelry pieces in which to cover their designs. \$30

March 24 & 31 Yarn Basket Weaving

Students will learn ancient basket weaving with colorful yarn over hemp, creating any shape of basket or decorative vessel by the finish. Two classes \$35

April 7 & 14 Papier Máché: "Easter" Patanky Eggs or Russian Dolls

Students will choose to make either a large egg which will be painted black and decorated with glow-bright colored designs or a simple oval shape to paint as a Russian doll. \$35

April 21 **Beginning Painting**

Students will use acrylic paints to create a finished painting and learn to chose a color scheme, mix colors, and shade objects. \$30

April 28 & May 5 Collage Workshop - Painting with paper

The class will begin by cutting images from a collection of art magazines, finding a theme and similar colors, and laying them out to make a picture. After cutting pieces to fit and overlay, they will be glued in place and sealed for a final picture. \$35

May 12 **Mosaic Tile Art**

This class will offer students several wooden designs to choose from and a choice of colored glass and ceramic tiles, shells, and jewelry pieces in which to cover their designs. \$30

Spinning: Fiber Spinning ◆ Middle School to Adults

Advanced Beginner to intermediate students This class is for spinners who wish to hone their skills, brush up or learn playing techniques, or for those with questions about or have problems with their wheels, etc. Teacher and student led.

If you've ever wanted to learn to knit socks, here's your chance!

Students will knot a simple pair of shortie socks. Pattern will be provided.

** Students need to bring 270 yards or (100 g) DK sport weight wool yarn, 1 set of size 3, 7" double pointed knitting needles (5 to a set), and a 3" stitch holder.

Students must know how to cast-on, knit, purl, increase/decrease, and cast-off. We will be "knitting in the round" and using the "long-tail" cast-on method. If you're not familiar with either of these methods, it would be to your advantage to research YouTube/internet or contact me in advance of class for a private lesson.

Students must know how to cast-on, knit, purl and cast off. Learn to make seamless garment; mittens, hats, gloves. In class, students will complete a mug cozy. Supply fee includes kit containing 1 set of Brittany wooden double pointed knitting needles and yarn to complete cozy. (\$20)

Knitting: After Beginning Knitting • Middle School to Adults

Thursdays, Mar 27-May 1 • 6:30-8:00 pm

Explore simple stitch combinations; ribbing, seed stitch, simple lave work and student led. Students need prior knowledge of casting on, knitting, purling, increasing/decreasing and casting off. Students should being their own yarn and needles.
