### **About Willow Oak Center for Arts & Learning**

Willow Oak was founded in 2007 by Muzetta Swann Miller in Springfield, TN to offer quality classes and performing opportunities for children and adults in the arts and humanities.



• More than 1,000 children and adults participate in arts programs at our 726 South Main Street location each year. Ongoing classes include art, calligraphy, photography, creative writing, cooking, weaving, knitting, and summer camps in addition to our popular painting parties.



#### **Music at Willow Oak**

• The Willow Oak Chorale was formed in 2009 under the leadership of Roger Bunch who worked as a choral and band director in Robertson County schools for over 40 years. The Chorale, open to adults and high school students, performs two concerts a year with orchestra. The Chorale's concert is a highlight of the annual spring gala.







• The Willow Oak Children's Choir is under the direction of Stephanie Edwards who brings years of experience to this program. The Children's Choir performs with the chorale and orchestra as well as presenting their own spring concert. The children who are in grades 3-8 also perform at Art in the Park.



• The Willow Oak Chorale and Children's Choir presented a beautiful Christmas concert on December 7, 2019 at Springfield Middle School. The adult/high school chorale and children's choir performed with a 20-piece orchestra, an extraordinary opportunity for these singers!

• Private lessons in piano, voice and guitar are offered by Willow Oak's teachers.







- Willow Oak offers two free festivals to the community each year. Approximately 1,000 children and adults attended the Multicultural Arts Festival in May 2019. 400 8<sup>th</sup> grade students were bused to The Center to participate in African dance and create art at no cost to the students. This two-day festival is funded by the Tennessee Arts Commission and corporate and individual donors.
- Art in the Park, a fine and folk arts festival, took place in September with 3,500 children and adults attending. They enjoyed art activities, music, food and artist/artisan vendors at J. Travis Price Park. The event was free and open to the public.





- Willow Oak received a \$20,000 Community Vibrancy Grant from the 3M Foundation. These funds cover the start-up costs of our new weaving program, 10 art classes for the YMCA's YCAP afterschool program, choral and orchestra music, art supplies for the Multicultural Arts Festival, \$2,000 of scholarships for summer arts camps, and general operating costs.
- Since 2014, Willow Oak has grown an average of 55% each year, and your support has been instrumental in that growth.

June 5<sup>th</sup> - Final dress rehearsal in Carnegie Hall; concert; post-concert cruise around the Statue of Liberty and lower Manhattan with music, dancing, and dinner.

June 6<sup>th</sup> - Hotel check-out and departure
