founded in 2007, Willow Oak now serves approximately 12,000 children, youth and adults in our onsite and outreach programs. Students participate in classes in the visual and performing arts, folk and fiber arts, culinary and expressive arts, and the humanities.

Visual arts include oil, acrylic and watercolor painting, drawing, pottery, photography, and calligraphy. Performing arts opportunities are music and theater. Our music program includes a chorale for adults and students in grades 7-12, a children's chorus, and individual music lessons. Classes are offered in acting and auditioning. Folk and fiber arts classes feature loom weaving, spinning, knitting, sewing, leatherworking, blacksmithing, and soap making. Classes in the culinary arts are offered to children and adults, beginner to gourmet. The expressive arts offer opportunities for personal growth. Humanities classes include writing and literature, publishing, languages including American Sign Language, history, and philosophy. Art camps are enjoyed by approximately 100 students each summer.
